

Community Rights & Responsibilities

As a Razorback you are a member of a community committed to excellence. The University of Arkansas is a community where students are nationally recognized and actively engaged in our campus and local community. The following rights and responsibilities are for all students living in the University of Arkansas residence halls. With rights comes responsibilities, and each individual has the responsibility to their community to uphold these rights, which complement the formal residence hall policies.

You have the right to be safe and secure.

You have the responsibility to keep your room door and hall doors locked, to not prop open unattended doors, and not to allow unescorted guests or strangers into the building.

You have the right to read, study, and sleep free from unreasonable noise and other distractions.

You have the responsibility to adhere to quiet, courtesy, and visitation hours and to remind others that you expect the same of them.

You have the right to choose your means of recreation and relaxation.

You have the responsibility to know and abide by the laws of the state of Arkansas including those that pertain to alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs. You have the responsibility to follow the rules and regulations established by the University.

You have the right to utilize your RA or other Residence Life or University staff when you need help with a problem.

You have the responsibility to notify a staff person with problems you are experiencing in a timely manner and to cooperate with him/her as while a resolution is being determined.

You have the right to a clean living space.

You have the responsibility to report any vandalism and to keep common spaces clean and free from trash, personal items, and damage.

You have the right to have individual differences respected.

You have the responsibility to value and support all cultures and backgrounds represented in the **RAZORBACK** family. You have the responsibility to model civility in all relationships and to intervene when others are not being treated with dignity and respect.
